Worship Corner

We are now in the season of Advent. Advent is not only that special time before Christmas, it is also a time of repentance and reflection. The name "advent" comes from the Latin words meaning "to come, to arrive". During this time of year, we reflect fondly on Christ's coming into the world in Bethlehem's manger, but we also look forward with eager anticipation to his coming again in power and great glory. 2020 brings with it the added twist of waiting for a return to normalcy to come as well. These will be the themes we explore through our Advent/Christmas worship series Christ is Coming. I hope you are able to join us on YouTube at 10:00 AM throughout the season (or whenever you can during the week) as we ready our hearts and minds for God's greatest gift to the world. Below is an overview of what you can expect in the weeks to come.

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT (11/29) "... so let us wait with hope!"

Scriptures: Isaiah 64:1-9; Mark 13:24-37

Synopsis: The halls are decked, and as we turn on our radios and watch our televisions, we notice that 'It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas'. But this year things are a little different. This year, we not only wait for the return of Christ (which is, after all half of the reason for the season of advent), and for the inevitable arrival of the holidays (there's the other half), but are waiting for a return to normalcy after a year that has been anything but. Today we ask, not only when all of these concerns will be resolved, but we also ask, what word might God have for us while we find ourselves waiting?

SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT (12/6) "... so let us prepare the way for peace!"

Scripture: Isaiah 40:1-11; 2 Peter 3:8-15a; Mark 1:1-8

Synopsis: As we await the arrival of Christmas, what can we do to grease the skids for that celebration of "Peace on Earth and Goodwill Toward Men." As we await the return of Christ, how can we witness to the truth of his coming kingdom? As we await a return to normalcy what practices can we begin that will enable us to re-engage with the world with renewed purpose and vigor? It is to these questions we will turn in today's worship service.

THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT (12/13) "... so let us rejoice!"

Scripture: Isaiah 61:1-4, 8-11; 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24; John 1:6-8, 19-28

Synopsis: There is a chill in the air. Trees are trimmed and the time is drawing near, so let us rejoice for family and friends, for hallmark movies and hot chocolate, for all those things that spark joy this time of year. Let us rejoice that Christ is coming to right wrongs, free prisoners, and bring God's joy to all the earth. Let us rejoice that amidst the sickness and uncertainty of our world, that better times are coming and soon and very soon our world will return to a sense of normalcy.

FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT (12/20) "... so let us share God's love!"

Scripture: Romans 16:25-27; Luke 1:26-38, 46-55

Synopsis: During the Christmas season, God invites us to share in his love. God's love is so great that it overflowed the bounds of heaven to find its way into the world where it would, "bring down the powerful from their thrones and lift up the lowly, fill the hungry with good things and send away the rich empty." God's love is coming still when we will all share in the riches of Christ's kingdom. And even now, during this time of uncertainty, God's love abides with us still... But this love isn't meant to be our private possession. Now, and in the coming days, let us look for ways to do what should come so naturally to Christians, let us share God's love with all.

Agape Ministry

We continue to ask for contributions to the Outdoor Pantry Box (on the west side of our building). You may just set your contributions on the shelves of the box. The food goes very quickly, often the same day it is stocked. The Pantry Box is incredibly successful at reaching those in need. Items needed include ready-to-eatfoods such as the following:

- sandwiches
- fruits
- fresh vegetables
- bread
- cheese and crackers
- · peanut butter
- cereal
- canned meats with easy open tops
- bottled water

Each Wednesday evening from 5:30 to 6:30 pm we serve to-go meals outside the south side of the building. Our plan is to continue doing this until such time as folks are allowed to return to a semi-normal life again. So far this year 4,986 meals have been served (243 of those to children).

A Letter to the Congregation

FCC Family & Friends,

In recent weeks, our nation has seen a resurgence in new cases of COVID-19. As many of you are aware, Oklahoma has been hit particularly hard, and current projections from the CDC indicate that levels of infection will continue to rise throughout the holiday season. In response to this increase, our Regional Minister the Rev. Pam Holt has advised all Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) congregations in the state to stop meeting in person for worship and to go back to online worship only until the crisis subsides.

While we have done a tremendous job social distancing, disinfecting, wearing our masks and ensuring that all applicable safety protocols have been followed during our Sunday morning worship services, it is the opinion of your Pastor, your Elders, and your General Church Board that it is simply too risky to continue meeting in person at this time. We are aware that this is the beginning of the Advent/ Christmas season. Rest assured that this decision was not made lightly. The church is the body of Christ, and it was the work of Jesus to make people well, not to make them sick by unnecessarily exposing them to risk. While we acknowledge that God is always in control, we are also aware that the Lord has gifted us with the intelligence and wisdom to know when to take reasonable precautions to ensure our safety and the safety of those around us.

Further, we have resolved to carry out our annual congregational meeting to approve our 2021 budget and elect new church officers via email and mail-in ballots. The meeting was scheduled for Sunday, December 13th. Those of you who are on our church email list will receive your ballot and a copy of the budget no later than December 6th. Those who are not on our email list will receive paper ballots in the mail by the 6th as well. If you are voting by mail, please drop them in the mail by Wednesday, December 9th to ensure that they will arrive in time for a vote count on the 13th. The 13th will also be the deadline for email voting. The office will notify you of the results by Monday, December 14th.

We hope for a drastic change in the situation soon. In the meantime, the board has committed to investigate returning to in-person worship at our January board meeting. Further, we are developing new ways of engaging in fellowship, Christian education, and spiritual development throughout the Advent season. We trust that during this "most wonderful time of the year" First Christian will still help us to meaningfully connect to the Christ who is the heart of Christmas.
